

COFFECUP REVOLUTION 2015

On September 10, 2015, the Coffee Cup Revolution will take place for the second consecutive year in Vancouver's Victory Square.

An anticipated 200 binners will collect coffee cups from around the Lower Mainland for a 5-cent refund per cup for one day.

The Coffee Cup Revolution is an event that is socially inclusive, rooted in its community, and geared towards waste reduction.

The Binners' Project engages local coffee producers, businesses, residents, and binners to explore solutions for waste reduction.

This initiative highlights the benefits that an extended refund system could have on urban environment, as well as for marginalised populations who could increase their income with the refund from used cups.



Indeed, if coffee cups where refundable, we believe:

- the streets would be cleaner;
- less waste would go into the landfill,
- the poorest people would make extra income by collecting them.



2014

The first Coffee Cup Revolution was held in Victory Square. Over 160 binners from across Vancouver redeemed collected coffee cups and participated in the building of coffee cup structures that reflected on issues relevant to the community.

We collected over 44,000 disposable coffee cups in 4 hours.

This event, organized by Ken Lyotier (Founder of United We Can), spoke to the need to partner with, and further support binners. It provided an opportunity for community engagement and created a space for social connection.
